



Fall 2018 Enrollment Information

- **Tuition Deposit**

In order to secure your seat in the incoming class, please submit your \$500 tuition deposit as described in your admission letter. Note that the deposit is non-refundable and will be credited toward your first tuition payment.

After depositing, you will have an opportunity to engage with our career services staff and begin working toward your career goals.

- **Financial Aid (U.S. Students)**

If you wish to apply for state or federal financial assistance, you must complete a [FAFSA](#) (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) as soon as possible.

The FAFSA is needed to determine eligibility for grants, loans, student employment, and scholarships. Contact the [Office of Financial Aid](#) at 303-871-4020 for more information.

- **Housing**

While the University of Denver does not offer on-campus housing for graduate students, the pleasant neighborhood surrounding DU offers a variety of options within walking distance of Korbel. Visit our [housing information](#) page to research your options.

- **Orientation & Registration**

Orientation is required for all incoming students. Specific details about arrival and registration will be emailed to deposited students in July 2018; however, please keep in mind the following dates:

 - Korbel's new student orientation is held from Tuesday, September 4 to Friday, September 9, 2018.
 - The first day of classes in the Fall 2018 quarter is Monday, September 10, 2018.

- **Tuition and Billing**

Tuition payments are due upon the completion of registration. Please contact the [Bursar's Office](#) for payment and fee information.



- Health Insurance and Immunization Requirements
All students enrolled in one or more credit hours are required to carry adequate health insurance and provide proof of immunization.

Students may either participate in the DU Student Health Insurance Plan or provide proof of other adequate health insurance. Students will receive detailed information regarding these requirements and additional instructions from the DU Health and Counseling Center after submitting their admission deposit. - Parking Permits
Korbel students are strongly encouraged to purchase a parking permit from the [Office of Parking Services](#). Parking around campus is extremely limited and constrained by time limits.

The University of Denver's [Office of Financial Aid](#) works closely with each student to make education affordable. We provide financial aid assistance and counseling services designed to help you finance your DU education. If you have questions, financial aid advisors are available by phone, email, and appointment Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m.

If you plan to apply for financial aid, submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible. The application can be submitted [online](#), and the University of Denver's **school code is 001371**. Your FAFSA information will be sent to DU electronically from the Department of Education, and you will be informed if any additional information is required before an offer of financial aid can be made.

In March, the Office of Financial Aid will begin emailing financial aid award notifications to students who submitted their FAFSA in early February. Please note that notifications will be sent to the email address you provided on the FAFSA itself. Students submitting the FAFSA after February 15 will have notifications sent to them approximately 2 – 3 weeks after submission. Your financial aid award may contain a combination of scholarships, work awards, and student loans to help you finance your education.

You can view your financial aid awards and accept, decline, or reduce offered aid via [PioneerWeb](#). You do not have to accept all the financial aid offered by DU. Remember that student loans must be repaid, and be sure to read the documents that are sent with your financial aid award notification. Your acceptance indicates that you will comply with the terms and conditions of financial aid awards. If you are accepting student loans, additional steps will be required before loan funds can be disbursed to your student account.

PioneerWeb is your online resource for managing your financial aid account. This secure website also allows you to view your financial aid information 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You can log in to PioneerWeb and select the Student or Incoming Graduate Student tab to view your financial aid information, verify the receipt of documents, and view any outstanding requirements. When reviewing your financial aid information, be sure to select the appropriate year.
